DESCRIPTION.

This plat of F. D. Dibble's First Addition to Ballard, Washington, embraces the east half of the South east quarter of the South west quarter of Section 1, Twp. 25, N. Range 3 East, W.M. containing 20 acres, more or less. The initial point of this plat is the South east corner of block 20 which is 20 feet north of the quarter corner between sections 1 & 12. The size of lots, blocks and the widths of streets and avenues areas marked on the face of the plat in feet.
